<p>MATHS</p> <p>This week we have continued our revision of formal written multiplication methods. We have calculated up to two by four digit numbers including decimals and also have used and applied these methods when solving worded problems</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">What is 2353×53? 3445×2.25?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">What would your 'top tips' be when explaining Long Multiplication?</p>
<p>ENGLISH</p> <p>Reading We began our whole class-reading book this week-'Now or Never – a Dunkirk story' by Bali Rai</p> <p>Poetry This was our first week of 'Poetry Fortnight'. We compared and contrasted different poems on the theme of winter and then closely examined one particular example, answering extended questions. We also prepared and performed poems in our classrooms – the winners will perform during Celebration Assembly next week.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">What do you think of the story so far? Explain your opinion.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Which poem did you perform? What makes a performance entertaining? What is the difference between a simile and metaphor?</p>
<p>SCIENCE</p> <p>Our new topic is called 'All Living Things' and we have begun by looking at the very smallest – micro-organisms. We have considered both the harmful and helpful kinds and we have set up an investigation to explore suitable growing conditions for mould!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Can you explain our investigation to your adult? What were the variables?</p>
<p>TOPIC</p> <p>We have begun our second half of our invasions topic by asking 'What was life like for children in London during World War Two?' We completed a prior knowledge quiz and then looked at the causes of the conflict.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">What were the causes of WW2? What was agreed at the Treaty of Versailles? Who were the key players?</p>
